Ajmal & His Family, Afghan Refugees

On Sunday, as our Fall Festival was getting under way, we met a family that is new to the neighborhood. Ajmal and Karima Mohammad and their two sons Omar (age 7) and Amir (age 3), have been resettled here by the International Rescue Committee (www.help.rescue.org).

Ajmal worked at the US Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan and was evacuated at the last minute as the Taliban rose to power. Although Ajmal speaks English quite well, his wife and children speak only Persian. They were permitted only one suitcase for the entire family, causing them to leave virtually all of their belongings behind. Ajmal humbly asked if we could help with their most pressing needs—clothing for the children, clothing and shoes for his wife, and a television or something that would help them pass the time in their apartment.

We secured a donation of a television, DVD player, DVDs, clothing, and some toys and books. If you would like to help Ajmal and his family, they could use additional clothing for the boys and gift cards to places such as Publix, WalMart, and Target. We are working with Ajmal to better understand what the IRC's plans are and how we can be of assistance. We invite you to pray for this family as they adjust to a brand new life in a place that is completely foreign to them.
